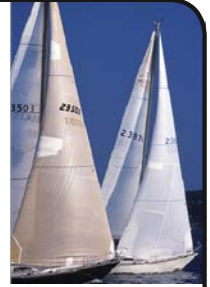

The Saint John Regional Hospital is the largest facility in New Brunswick and serves a population of 200,000 in the southern part of the province. The Emergency Department sees a volume of 56,000 patients, and is supported by 23 areas of specialty medicine and surgery, and a vast array of research, education, health promotion activities and community partnerships.

We are actively seeking an emergency physician to lead the Knowledge Translation mission. The successful candidate will be expected to work clinically in the emergency department and will receive an additional 0.25 full time position in academic funding.

We are seeking someone who is knowledgeable and

passionate about patient safety and incorporating evidence into practice. They must have experience applying evidence based medicine principles and have excellent organizational skills. To continue to engage staff in this process they will need refined interpersonal skills and be able to work effectively on interdisciplinary teams involving all levels of health care providers.

A nationally competitive Academic Funding Plan compensates our physicians for clinical excellence, medical education, research and administration. The successful applicant will be compensated at an hourly rate for their clinical shifts and general contribution to the department, receive a stipend for their knowledge translation work and are eligible to receive additional funding for specific academic and administrative projects. Applicants must be eligible for licensure in the Province of New Brunswick. All positions require FRCP (EM), CCFP (EM), ABEM, or CCFP with extensive experience in Emergency Medicine, and be eligible for an academic appointment from Dalhousie University.
